REGION:

Known as the King of Beaujolais, the highly acclaimed Moulin-à-Vent Cru boasts the most full-bodied and structured wines found in the region. Grapes for the Maison L'Envoyé Moulin-à-Vent come from the Terre de Thé vineyard, where the distinctive tea-colored soil produces wine with red and black fruit characters and a lengthy, complex finish.

WINEMAKING:

The fruit was de-stemmed and the whole berries underwent a long, natural ferment utilizing wild yeasts in open-top vessels. The wine matured over the following 11 months in third use French oak, achieving a subtle integration of oak spice characters.

TASTING NOTES:

Raspberry and blackberry fruits abound, speckled with hints of violet and mushroom on the nose of our first vintage of Moulin-à-Vent. Ripe fruit opens the show on the generous, round palate, with clove spice bringing up the rear. This is a far cry from Beaujolais Nouveau. Rather, it's a complex, versatile wine that keeps us coming back for more.
